Charges

Eiri McDavid was arrested on January 13 2006 in Auburn California for allegedly conspiring the arson of an "unknown target" as part of an Earth Liberation Front campaign. Although no arson was ever committed, Eric was convicted under draconian anti-"terrorism" laws of conspiracy.



The case against Eric was built almost exclusively on the testimony of a paid confidential source and agent provocateur, an individual deliberately sent by Federal law enforcement to investigate and instigate. According to court documents, this provocateur received \$75,000 USD for her efforts. After his conviction, one of the juror's stated to the media that the FBI "should be embarrassed of themselves for what they did with this case," that most jurors felt the testimony of the confidential source couldn't be trusted unless backed up with audio recordings, and that the jury had only voted to convict because the defense's argument that the FBI used entrapment on Eric was overturned by questionable instructions by the judge in the trial.

While incarcerated awaiting trial, Eric undertook a number of hunger strikes to secure access to vegan food. Although the hunger strikes were successful, Eric remains in solitary confinement.

Eric is due to be sentenced on Feb. 28, 2008 and is currently seeking a retrial based on the judge's legally dubious jury instruction.
