Charges

Since March of 2004, Tre Arrow has been incarcerated in Victoria, British Columbia, awaiting possible extradition to the United States.

In the summer of 2001, five vehicles belonging to two companies involved in the contentious timber sale in God's Valley, Oregon were destroyed by arson. Jacob Sherman, a 21 year-old student, was arrested for the action. As part of plea bargain, Sherman named Tre as the 'mastermind' behind the arsons. With no material evidence other than the testimony of Sherman, which was extracted under the duress of a potential 80 year sentence, Federal and state police issued a warrant for Tre, a well-know and effective above-ground environmental activist.

Fearing that due to his effective legal activism he would not get a fair trial, Tre sought asylum in Canada. On March 13, 2004, Tre was arrested in Victoria on immigration charges. He has been held in prison since.
